### A New Resort for Nevis

While St. Kitts has been the focus of development with the recent opening of [Belle Mont Farm](#) and an anticipated Park Hyatt, Nevis, the smaller sibling in the Caribbean nation of St. Kitts and Nevis, will get a new villa resort Jan. 15 when [Paradise Beach Nevis](#) opens.

Comprised of seven three- and four-bedroom villas, the new property resuscitates the former Villa Paradiso development that opened in 2002 and closed six years later. The designer Adam Tihany, best known for restaurants such as Per Se in New York, originally designed the villas in Balinese style with thatched roofs.

Over the course of a two-year renovation, the roofs have been rewoven and furnishings updated under new ownership.

The beachfront property combines the privacy of villa residency with the service features of a resort, including a private beach bar, villa butlers and a concierge. The villas are located on Paradise Beach, about a 10-minute walk from the Four Seasons Resort Nevis, which operates several restaurants and a full-service spa.

Discounted from Jan. 15 to 30, villas will start at \$1,000 nightly, with a three-night minimum. Regular rates go into effect Feb. 1, with villas from \$2,700 nightly.
